Marriage is a Holy Covenant

"Another thing you do: You flood the LORD's altar with tears. You weep and wail because He no longer pays attention to your offerings or accepts them with pleasure from your hands. 14 You ask, "Why?" It is because the LORD is acting as the witness between you and the wife of your youth, because you have broken faith with her, though she is your partner, the wife of your marriage covenant." Mal 2:13-14

1. Initiated by a promise - Wedding vows
2. Bound by conditions - I will leave, cleave and become one with you
3. Certified by blood - The first sexual relationship
4. Verified by a sign - The wedding token/ring or offspring

Marriage is an irrevocable commitment of unconditional love toward and imperfect person forever.

Implications of the Covenant Marriage

- Marriage is intended for life. Mal. 2:16
- Sex outside of marriage is a violation of the covenant. Matt. 5:27-30; Matt. 5:19
- Marriage is reserved for one man and one woman. Gen. 2:23-25; 1 Cor. 6:9; Rom. 1:18-32

A Covenant Marriage is a God-Centered Marriage

Man-centered marriage - we will maintain our marriage as long as our earthly comforts, desires and expectations are met.

God-centered marriage - we will preserve our marriage because it brings glory to God and points the world to a reconciling creator.

1. See yourself pleasing God as you love your spouse.

"So we make it our aim to please Him." 2 Cor. 5:9

2. Realize you must die to your wants constantly.

“Those who live should no longer live for themselves but for Him who died for them and was raised again.” 2 Cor. 5:15

3. See your spouse as the one Christ died for.

“So from now on we regard no one from a worldly point of view” 2 Cor. 5:16
