God Is Our Father

Luke 12:22-36

The question, "Will God provide?" comes from a scarcity mindset that is rooted in fear.

Am I good enough for God to provide for me?
Have I done enough for God to provide for me?
Does God love me enough for Him to provide for me?

1. Will God provide: An issue of God's character.

"Consider the ravens...God feeds them...Consider the lilies...God clothes them..."

When living in fear the temptation is to take matters into our own hands.

2. How will God provide: An issue of God's ability.

"The ravens do not now sow or reap, they have no storeroom or barn; yet God feeds them." "The lilies do not labor or spin, yet not even Solomon was dressed like one of these."

When living in fear the temptation is to take matters into our own hands.

3. When will God provide: An issue of God's timing.

"Do not worry about your life...Why do you worry about the rest?...do not worry...Do not be afraid!"

When living in fear the temptation is to take matters into our own hands.

4. We need to think differently about our lives: An issue of the Kingdom vs the World.

"Life is more than food and the body more than clothes...your Father has been pleased to give you the Kingdom." Vs 23,32

"Do not worry about it. For the pagan world runs after such things...but seek first His Kingdom, and these things will be given to you as well." Vs 30-31

"Sell your possessions and give to the poor. Provide purses for yourselves that will not wear out, a treasure in heaven that will not be exhausted...where your treasure is, there your heart will be also." Vs 33-34

"Be dressed ready for service and keep your lamps burning, like men waiting for their master..." Vs 35-36

Thoughts as we linger with Jesus.

- 1. Be honest (confession) "Jesus, I am worried about my life."
- 2. Ask God to change your thinking (repentance) "Jesus, give me your thoughts about my life."
- 3. Receive His comfort and strength (transformation through faith) "Jesus, I receive your truth and will trust you."
