Our New Kingdom Purpose: Christ's Ambassadors

- Ambassadors in the Roman World
 - Two Types of Roman provinces
 - 1. Senate controlled peaceful, with no troops stationed.
 - 2. Emperor controlled turbulent with troops stationed. Assigned an ambassador to speak for the emperor.
 - The ambassador speaks for the emperor with the emperor's full authority.
 - The ambassador lives among foreign people to bring peaceful assimilation into the Roman kingdom.
 - The honor of the sending country is in the hands of the ambassador.
- Christ's Ambassadors
 - We represent King Jesus on earth: Where we are, the Kingdom of God is.
 - Our task is to function in the Name of King Jesus: Reconcile people to the King.
 - We must retain the culture and nature of heaven to be effective on earth.
 - The honor of King Jesus is in our hands.
